north to 11th and Main where he was advised by a person standing there that "your hotel just exploded". He states he looked up and saw which room on the fourth floor had had the explosion, and he reentered the hotel. When he went into the hotel, someone asked him to go to the fourth floor and check for fire. He states he went to the elevator and at that point, the elevator opened and he assisted the two men in carrying the injured person out of the elevator onto the floor. He states he then went to the fourth floor, room 405 and could see there was no fire in the room, however, there was extensive damage from an explosion. He states approximately at that time fire bureau personnel arrived and started checking the room. About three to five minutes later, police personnel arrived and started checking the room also. He states he returned to the foyer and was advised that there was a possibility that a light blue or a silver colored car, possibly a Chevette, had been involved. He left the hotel and checked the area in a five block circumference around the hotel in a spiral search in an attempt to locate the light blue, silver Chevette. He had negative results. He also states that during his search, he found no yellow Volkswagen's in the area.

I next interviewed [ ] (tape #5, side #1). She states she is the "[ ]". She explained the procedure used when cleaning the rooms, and stated that she did not clean room 405 herself, however, would have insured that 405 was clean upon the person checking out.

I next interviewed [ ] (tape #5, side #1). She states that she is the person assigned to the fourth floor and is sure that she cleaned room 405 on July 23, 1983. She states that she would strip the bed, vacuum under the beds and the whole floor, check the bathroom medicine cabinet for anything left behind, clean the bathroom, clean the closet and the dresser drawers, and then secure the room for the next customer. She was asked what she would do should she find any valuables in the room and she stated that they would be bagged and taken to the front desk. She was asked if she could recall whether or not she found anything of value in the room at that time, and she stated that the room was clean and there was nothing of value in the room. She further stated that she did not believe the room had been rented out until July 29, 1983, when the key was given to [ ]. She states the room remains locked from the time she finished cleaning until the key was given to [ ] to go to his room.

I next interviewed [redacted] (tape #5, side #1 and #2). She states that the last registered guest in room 405, prior to [redacted], was a [redacted], that he registered on July 22, 1983, and checked out on July 23, 1983. She showed me the registration form filled out by this individual. She checked the register and found that no other guest had been assigned room 405 until [redacted] arrived. I asked how many pass keys there are in the hotel. She states that the hotel has eight sets of pass keys, and that at this time she can account for five, one set that is broken and four good sets. She states that she will check with the rest of the staff to determine whether or not some of the staff have pass keys in their possession, and contact me later with this information.

Upon checking the phone register, I found that no phone calls had been made from the hotel after 1954 hours on the 28th of July, 1983. Phone call made after that time was at 0116 hours on 29 July, 1983, and this was to 911 when the desk clerk called to report the explosion. We then checked the status of the room 405 that the computer had at 1225 hours on 29 July, 1983. The status was "one". This means the room was empty and clean.

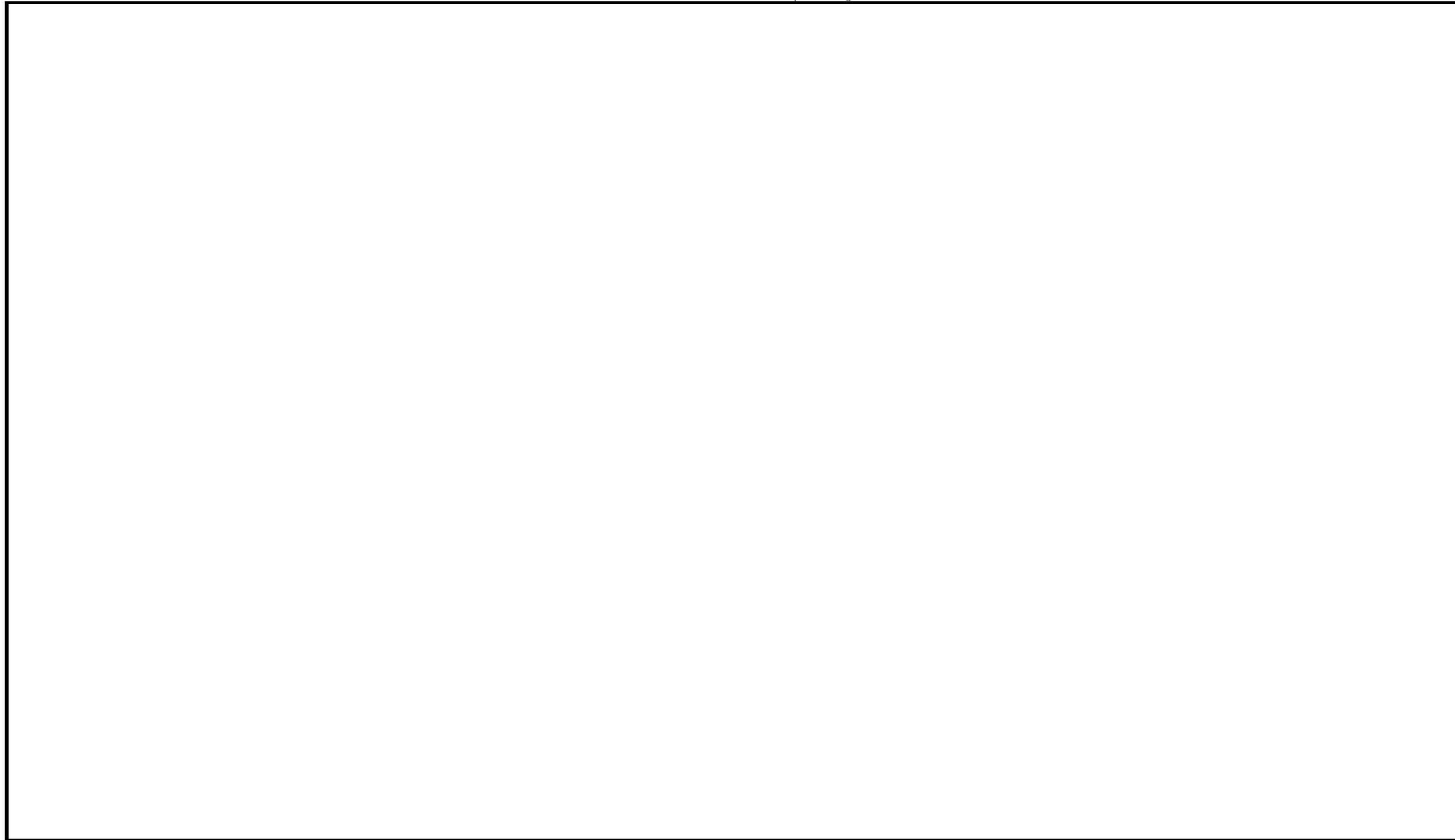

We then proceeded to the Radio Shack located at 1716 S Western Av, Los Angeles. There we contacted [redacted], an employee. We showed him receipt #C-01847, and asked if he remembered filling out this receipt, and selling the items to this individual. He stated he remembered the individual, as this individual called ahead to see whether or not they had the clock and asked if they

would set it aside for him. He states that when the individual arrived he purchased the clock and a glue dispenser, paying him in a \$20 bill. He states he remembered the individual as a [redacted] male, [redacted] build. He states that this person was wearing a white T-shirt and black pants. He further states that what makes him remember this man so well is he was in a "hurry" and did not want the box and/or instructions, just the clock. I showed him the mug throwdown folder containing six photographs, two color and four black and white. I asked if he could identify any of the people on the throwdown and he stated it was either 4 or 5. He then looked at the folder more closely and pointed to 5, stating, "No, that's him. That's the one who was in the store."

We then went to the Radio Shack store located at 3218 W Slausan, Los Angeles, California. It should be noted that this store is the only Radio Shack that requires an armed guard while open. We contacted a [redacted]. He states that he is the person that was on duty and sold the clock to this individual and that his initials appear in the corner, that being [redacted]. He states that the individual gave him \$12 cash for a clock. Our concern was that of the date on the receipt, July 27, 1983. Our information showed that [redacted] was in Oregon at the Rajneeshpuram on July 27, 1983. Upon further investigation we found that receipt #A-15092 was dated July 21, 1983. We also found that receipt #A-15094 was dated July 21, 1983. [redacted] stated that he must have made a mistake, as these receipts are all picked up and logged at one time, and could not have been made out on the 27th. He states at first that this individual was a [redacted] male, [redacted] years, [redacted] complexion, [redacted] hair with glasses and a [redacted] nose and [redacted] lips. That the individual told him that he was a [redacted], that he [redacted]. At this time [redacted], the store manager came up to [redacted] and told him that he was not correct, that he [redacted] remembered the individual who had purchased the clock, as he was one of the few [redacted] individuals that come into the store. He states that this individual purchased the only clock, stock #63-716 of this design that [redacted] had in the store. [redacted] states that this clock is replacing stock #63-715, and that he has not received any others of that nature in the store. He states this is one of the reasons, besides the fact that the suspect is [redacted], that he remembers him. When asked for a description he states that the individual was a [redacted] male, approximately [redacted] years old, [redacted]

but he could not remember much more. He states that the sale had to take place in the early afternoon of July 21, 1983, or after 1600 hours on July 21, 1983. He states there is no way the individual could have purchased any items on July 27, 1983 and used this receipt. We showed [ ] the series of photographs on the mug folder, and [ ] stated that he could not make an identification at this time. We then showed the mug shots to [ ], he picked #5 (suspect) and stated "This could be him, however, I'm not sure. But he's one of the few [ ] that came into my store." [ ] then showed us a 555 timer and stated this could be used as a timing device.

We next went to the Radio Shack located at 270 Carlson Mall in Carlson, California. We found that the person we needed to talk to, one [ ], had gone off duty. I gave my business card to the clerk and asked that she call [ ] and make arrangements for us to meet with him. She did so and we drove to his address at [ ], Long Beach, California. [ ] stated he remembered this sale, as this individual comes into the Radio Shack store quite often and "never buys anything." [ ] stated he really didn't want to wait on him due to the fact that he spends a lot of time and buys nothing. [ ] states he was quite surprised when the individual bought so much equipment from their store. I then showed him the mug shot folder that I had with me and he immediately pointed to #5 saying "That's him, that's the man. I've seen him many times." He states that he had not come in the store by himself but was with another person. He states this person was a [ ] male, [ ] set, [ ] hair [ ] length, with a [ ] and [ ] wire-framed glasses and could speak poor English. He states that he [ ] was born and raised in [ ], and feels this individual was either [ ]. He further states that the individual with [ ] paid for the items with two \$50 bills. That this individual had a large roll of money, he looked away so as not to make it so obvious that he was looking at the money. He further stated that these two individuals stayed in the store for approximately 15-20 minutes. I asked if he could recall what day of the week it was, and he stated it was July 16, looking at the calendar he said it was a Saturday. I asked him to look over the sales receipt and tell me what these items could be used for. He stated that what was purchased here could be used for a number things. I asked him to add a 555 timer and whether or not this

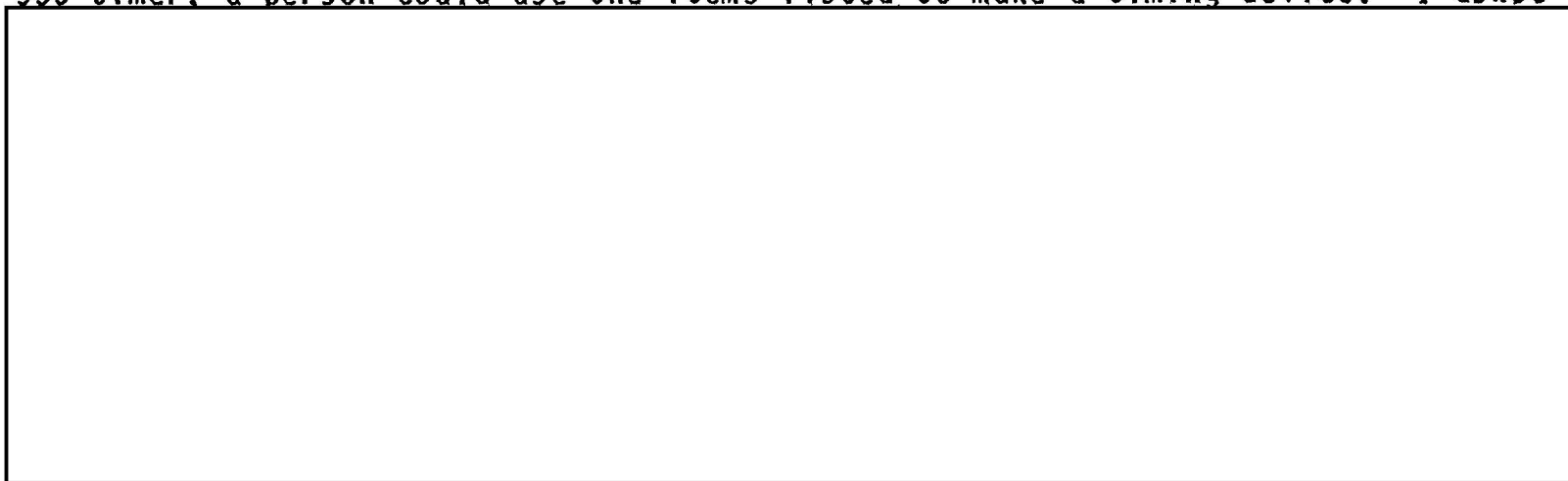

I asked where an individual could get the information on how to set up a 555 timer, he states that the book listed on receipt A-15213, stock 276-5002, engineering book #2, has a very detailed description, diagrams and explanations on how to set up a 555 timer. I asked [redacted] if he felt whether or not he could identify a photograph or artist's conception of the person that was with [redacted] in the store. He stated he felt that he could.

Contact was made with Detective [redacted] in Portland and a request that the artist's conceptions of the two additional suspects be Thermofaxed to the FBI in Los Angeles, and delivered to us.

On August 5, 1983, the Federal Bureau of Investigation delivered the two Thermofax artist's conceptions of the individuals that were with [redacted] at the Rajneeshpuram.

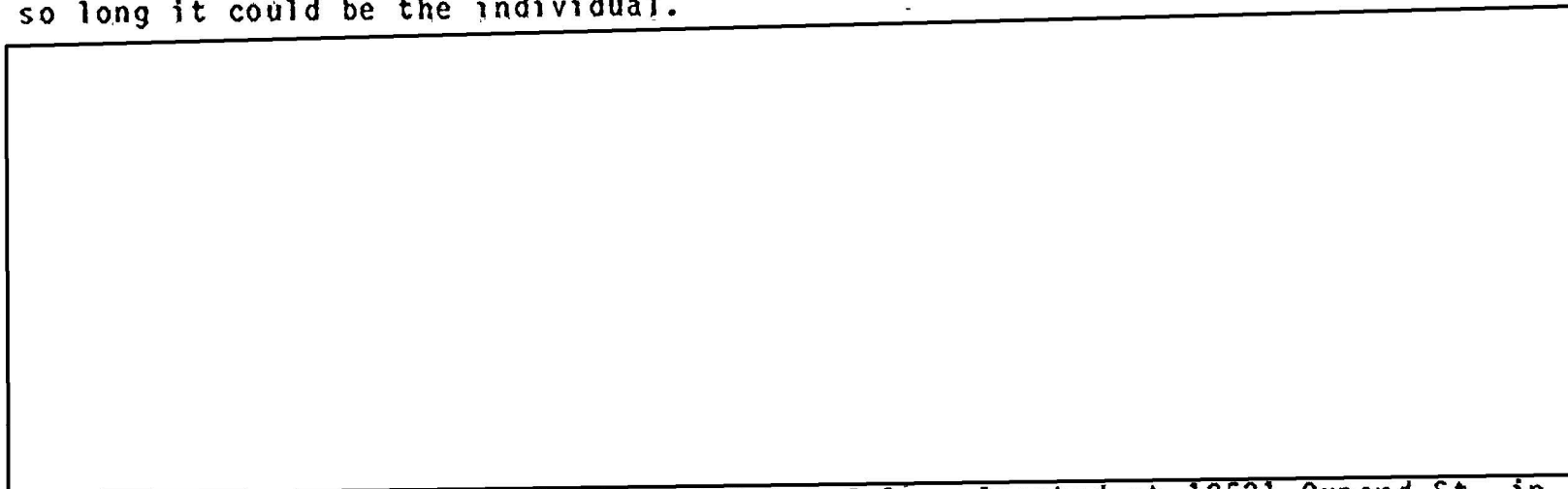

From here we went to the location of B & B Sales, located at 12521 Oxnard St, in North Hollywood, California. There I contacted a [redacted]. He states that he did sell the shotgun listed on their receipt number 81-918, the shotgun shells listed on their receipt 209434 and the other items listed on receipt 210917 to one [redacted]. He also showed us a copy of the form required by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, a Firearms Transaction Record, Action 64232. This was filled out by [redacted] with the address on [redacted]. I was further advised that they do not keep records on the sale of gunpowder and that they do not sell black powder at the store, only smokeless powder.

that [redacted] sold this vehicle on July 4th, 1980 to [redacted]. The reason for this sale was that [redacted] had wrecked the vehicle and it was not repairable. [redacted] owned a Volkswagen repair shop and stripped the auto for usable parts. [redacted] reported to Detective [redacted] that the license plates were attached to the vehicle at the time of sale. [redacted] was described by [redacted] as being a M [redacted] in his late [redacted] having a [redacted] build and [redacted] hair. Some time after 070480 [redacted] sold his business to [redacted] of Madera, California. Detective [redacted] stated that he would have [redacted] contacted and if there was any further information he, Detective [redacted], would contact this office.

On 080383 at 1600 hours a subpoena was delivered to the Security Office of Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone. This subpoena was for toll information from 3 pay telephones located at RAJNEESH PURAM for 072783 and 072883. This information was relayed to Detective [redacted] in the Los Angeles area by telephone upon receipt.

On 080983 at 1230 hours, accompanied by Detective [redacted], I transported [redacted] from room [redacted] of Good Samaritan Hospital to the Rocky Butte Jail. Previously being aware of a court order dated 080383 prohibiting Governmental interviews of this defendant without assistance of Defense Council present I made no attempt to discuss this case with [redacted]. [redacted] only comment during my contact with him was regarding the type of vehicle he was riding in. When [redacted] asked what type of a vehicle it was I informed him that it was a Chrysler. [redacted] stated its nice to ride in a new car I have an old clunker that is a Ford. [redacted] was transported to Rocky Butte Jail without incident.

At the request of Detective [redacted], accompanied by Investigator [redacted] of this office, I made contact with the Manager at the Continental Motel. The Manager, [redacted], assisted in locating the registration form for [redacted]. The registration form number is 10017. The registration occurred on the evening of 080483 and [redacted] checked out on 080583. The registration was for two people and [redacted] listed his home address as [redacted] Sacramento, California. The vehicle listed on the registration form was a 1980 Chevette bearing California license [redacted].

states his roommate, [redacted], told him there was a fire in the hall. He states he got up went to the hall and could see smoke, and the smoke had an acrid smell to it. He states he could hear somebody yelling "help me, help me". He states he then went looking to see whether or not access to the fire escape was available. He states [redacted] then went to help whoever it was yelling for help, and that he [redacted] went down the fire escape to his office. He states when he got to the first floor, he saw a person [redacted] lying on the floor with people around him attempting to give aid to this individual. He states he went over to this individual in an attempt to see if he could help him. He states that it was obvious this individual was involved in some sort of an explosion, as the hair had been partially melted and his face was charred and there was blood in the eye sockets. He states that one of the hands had been partially amputated. He further stated it was interesting that the individual with severe injuries that he had, was not losing very much blood and was breathing quite well. He states this individual [redacted] continued saying that he was hurt and wanted help. [redacted] states he asked this individual [redacted] what had happened. [redacted] told him "I was just curious what was in the medicine cabinet"; he states that [redacted] said this numerous times. [redacted] then asked [redacted] to "get him out of the building" and asked if he could get him to a hospital, then would say again just get me out of the building. He seemed to know what was going on around him, and would say things like "help me, help me", "I can't see", "Get me to a hospital", "Get me out of this building". I asked if anyone removed [redacted] wallet from him at this time, and [redacted] stated "to the best of my knowledge, no one removed any wallet". [redacted] was then sent to the hospital, and he [redacted] started calming people down who were residents of the hotel. He states that he was in the lobby of the hotel when the other two explosions occurred, and they all evacuated the hotel. I asked if he knew this person that was on the floor [redacted]. He stated he couldn't tell, as this person [redacted] had melted hair and his face had been blacked by the blast. I asked if this individual [redacted] had a beard. He stated that he thought he may have had a beard, but couldn't say for sure. I asked if he felt this individual [redacted] was a sannyasin (a member of the Rajneesh faith). [redacted] states he did not

believe that this individual was a sannyasin, as he was wearing blue jeans and a true sannyasin would not wear blue jeans. I asked where the fire escape was that he had used, and he stated it was on the north side of the building on Main St., between S.W. 11th and S.W. 12th. I asked what his feelings were as to the injuries this individual had, and how they would be caused. He said a person had to be very close to an explosion to have his hair melt, that it was extremely obvious the individual was involved in an explosion, and that the injuries were not likely caused from opening a medicine cabinet. He states that the injuries were caused by a tearing rather than a cutting. He states that there were no apparent injuries below the waist, however, above the waist there was quite extensive injuries. [redacted] states that if an individual had been a distance away from an explosion, the entire body would be involved, however, only one third of this individual's body was involved in the explosion. He further states that he has been an ER doctor in the past, and has had some experience with trauma and severe injuries. I asked him if there was anything else he could offer at this time, and he stated there was not.

We next interviewed [redacted] at 1448 hours. She was to check into some missing keys and get back to me about this. I asked about the keys, and she stated that there had been eight keys total for the building. She states she can now account for eight keys. I asked her to give me this accounting, and she stated there are still six good sets of keys, and two sets have been broken. I asked if she had a regular locksmith that serviced the building, and stated it was a [redacted] and that this individual lives at the Rajneeshpuram near Antelope, OR. She further states that a key security system is now in effect and it is very difficult to get the pass keys any longer. Whether or not they will change the locks in the hotel has not been decided. I asked how long she had been [redacted] at this hotel, and she stated approximately three months. She stated she had taken over as [redacted] from a [redacted] and that he is now in the fire service at the ranch. Her assistant manager is [redacted]. She could give no further information.

SIR: [redacted] and I went to the city of Rajneesh Puram to interview possible witnesses in this case.

Our first interview was with [redacted]. [redacted] stated he is a counselor in the Meditation Center and was conducting an evening session and had just ended said session at approximately 9:30 p.m. on the 27th of July, 1983. He stated that he went to the Tea Room at approximately 10:00 p.m. and observed three people in the Tea Room. He states these three people appeared to be out of place. He talked with them and was advised they had checked in and were presently staying in a tent overnight. One of the individuals asked about the dynamic meditation program that would occur at approximately 0600 in the morning.

[redacted] stated he was unsure as to which one had asked the questions about the dynamic mediation. I asked if he could describe the three individuals. He described one as a [redacted] male wearing a brown serape, that this man appeared to be very [redacted]. Number two he described as a [redacted] male, [redacted] appearing, with [redacted] hair, the hair was [redacted] length and [redacted]. This person was wearing blue jeans rolled approximately 4" at the cuff. A third individual he could only describe as a [redacted] male as he paid very little attention to him. I asked if any of these individuals were wearing red clothing and he stated they were not. He stated that he talked to these persons and asked them how long they were going to stay and was advised by one of the [redacted] males that they would stay approximately a day or so. The [redacted] male asked whether or not they could purchase red clothing at the ranch, and he advised them that if they were only going to stay one or two days, they did not need to buy red clothing. This individual then told them that he wanted get something that was comfortable so he could do the dynamic meditation. [redacted] states they appeared to be very friendly and during the conversation, the [redacted] male and the other [redacted] male said very little, but the [redacted] male wearing the Levis with the rolled up cuffs seemed to talk quite a bit with [redacted], however, he was not able to give the total gist of the conversations.

We next talked with [redacted]. He stated that on July 27, 1983, he had two contacts with the subjects, the first was at 10:00 p.m. He states he was driving a taxi on the ranch, when he was called to come to the registration center and transport three individuals to the university. I asked if he could describe these three individuals. He described number one as [redacted] male--quite tall, number two as a [redacted] male about the same height but heavier. He did not give a description on the third individual. [redacted] states that these individuals told him that they had come from L. A. and had wanted to come to the ranch for quite a long time. He states they appeared very friendly and eager to please. He states he drove them to the university where he assisted them in checking in with the staff at the university. [redacted] states that they did have suitcases and suitbags, however, he could not give any detailed descriptions. individuals appeared to have any foreign accents and none of them wore glasses as far as he could tell. He states that one of the [ ] males appeared to have a [ ]. He states he left them at the university and went back to his job.

About 12:00 a.m., he observed these individuals walking around. He told them there was nothing to do at this time of night and that they might as well go to bed. He advised them that they were not in L. A. now and that the shops and stores were all closed up. He states he left them walking down the country road. He stated that he felt it strange that these individuals would be up and walking around when they planned on doing dynamic meditation at 0600 hours in the morning. [ ] states he saw the [ ] male and one of the [ ] males on 072883 walking down the road, however, he had no conversation or contact with him at this point.

I next interviewed [ ]. She states that she first had contact with the individuals on the evening of the 27th of July, 1983 at approximately 1930 to 1945 hours. She states she observed them walking towards the city hall, that their appearance was quite a bit different than most of the guests at the ranch. She next saw them at 11:00 a.m. on the 28th of July, 1983 when she was giving a tour. She states a [ ] male got in the bus and asked if she would wait for his two friends. When the other two men arrived, they did not have tickets and all three had to get off the bus and go back to the reception center and obtain tickets for the tour. I asked her if she could describe the individuals, starting with the one that had just got in the bus and asked them to stop and wait. She states he was a [ ] male, approximately [ ] years, [ ], [ ] chested, and he reminded her of a "hippie" or someone from California. He had [ ] hair and a [ ], he was wearing a red T shirt and the face appeared to be very [ ]. She stated that a [ ] male then got onboard and said "hello" and that they appeared to be very friendly. She states that of the two [ ] and a [ ], the [ ] male appeared to be the most friendly and outgoing of the bunch. They then went down to the river and looked around. They got back on the bus and returned to the starting point. She stated that the other [redacted] male appeared to be [redacted] or something of that nature, and he also had a [redacted] nose with somewhat [redacted] hair. She stated that this individual, the one she felt was [redacted], is the one that entered the bus with the [redacted] male.

I next interviewed [redacted]. She stated that she observed the individuals on 27th of July, 1983 at approximately 1830 hours. She states she was working in the university and, at first, a [redacted] male and a [redacted] male entered the building, and then finally another [redacted] male entered the building. They filled out the forms and the [redacted] male and the [redacted] male filled out the backs only as directed, however, one of the [redacted] males filled out both sides. They had to fill in forms agreeing that they would not have any meat or dope, etc. on the ranch. They laughed about having to throw away a meat sandwich prior to coming out to the ranch. They did not tell her where they came from, and at this point, an individual by the name of [redacted] took over. (See special report dated 073083, page 17). She described the [redacted] male as [redacted], very [redacted] complected, approximately [redacted] years, wearing blue jeans and a T shirt. The first [redacted] male was [redacted], about [redacted] years old, shorter than the [redacted] male, no [redacted] or [redacted] that he had [redacted] length hair. That the other [redacted] male that entered the area was shorter than the [redacted] male, however, taller than the other [redacted] male, that he was older, approximately [redacted] years. On 28th of July, 1983 about noon she observed the three again near the Zenn Connection, that they were walking towards the shops in that area. She got the impression that this individual was the "boss" and that the other two, the [redacted] male and other [redacted] male were uncomfortable talking and walking with him. She states that at this point in time, they all appeared to red or some form of red color.

We next interviewed [redacted]. [redacted] stated that she was in the reception area when one individual came in requesting his car keys. This was on the day they left, July 28, 1983. She asked what his name was, and he stated [redacted]. She then asked his first name and he told her [redacted]. I asked what time this was and she said between 1500 and 1700 hours. She stated that he appeared to be in a hurry and stated they were leaving right away. She states that he used the toilet and left. He did not have any bags with him and was alone. She states that this occurred on the 27th of July, 1983, in the evening hours. She states when she observed them, they were not wearing red at that time.

Our next interview was with [redacted]. hospital with [redacted], and contacted a clerk in the ER room of the hospital (Emanuel Hospital). This clerk asked if they were there regarding the injured individual, and they stated they were. When they gave the name that [redacted] registered under [redacted] this clerk told them this is not the name that we have for him. The clerk gave them the name [redacted] and then they opened his wallet to verify his name. The clerk handed the ID and wallet to [redacted], and [redacted] states he observed a California drivers license, a [redacted] employee's card, and other papers with names and phone numbers on them. [redacted] admitted to copying everything down that was on any piece of paper in the wallet, however, states that all items were placed back into the wallet and he took nothing from the wallet. I asked if he observed any money in the wallet, and he stated there was no money at all in the wallet that he could see. He stated that he asked the desk manager if there was any money in the wallet and was told that they have not seen any money in the wallet or on the person of [redacted] at the time he checked into the hospital. [redacted] states he was not present at the hotel during the second or third explosions and was advised of these two explosions by the desk man at Emanuel Hospital. [redacted] further states he did not see or talk to [redacted], however, could hear [redacted] yelling in the hospital that he was hurt.

I next interviewed [redacted].

She states she took men for a horseback ride on the 28th of July, 1983. She states as she rode to the corral on the bus with them, however, at that time did not know they were going on a horseback ride with her and did not talk then. She states that there was one [redacted] male and one [redacted] male. She further states that the [redacted] male appeared to be a good rider and the [redacted] male did not. I asked her to describe the [redacted] male for us. She stated that they seemed quite interested to know whether or not people could leave the commune once they had joined the Rajneesh religion and moved to the commune and were surprised when they were told people could come and go anytime they wanted to. She states the [ ] male did most of the talking, and when the [ ] male asked how most of the people got there, he seemed skeptical at her answer. I asked if they were polite and courteous and she stated they did not mock her or give her any hard times, were very polite and courteous and seemed generally interested in the religion. She states they never did ask about the Bajwan or talk about their own religion. She stated that she had bad feelings from these two individuals and did not go on a 1½ hour ride, but just an hour ride with them. She stated this was not from anything they said or did, but just a feeling. She states they asked where the food came from and what they foods they grew and produced at the ranch themselves. I asked if at any time they discussed the Hotel Rajneesh in the city of Portland and she stated they did not. They did not ask questions about any sexual practices or anything else pertaining to "controversial items".

that he would have to talk to the visitor center. He made a phone call to the reception center, and asked about the horse rides. He bought two T shirts, one large, one extra large. He stated he was buying one for a friend (the extra large), paid cash approximately \$30. I asked her to describe him and she stated he was a [redacted] male, [redacted] centimeters, in the late [redacted] body, but not [redacted] hair, [redacted] facial hair like he was attempting to [redacted]. She states he had [redacted] lips and was wearing blue jeans and a multi-colored shirt.

She states that later that afternoon, approximately 4:00 p.m., she observed the individuals again. They were walking in front of the university and the [redacted] male had the shirt on that she sold him, and was wearing blue jeans. Buddha Hall. They stopped at Zorba the Buddha (a restaurant). They had luggage with them, and told him that they were leaving, told him they were out of money, and that they were going back to Los Angeles, that's where they were from. They talked about the center in Los Angeles, called Schravan, and the fact that it had closed. They asked for the nearest meditation center would be and were told in Laguna Beach, California and this was called Utsava. They asked when the best days to go would be and they were told it's best to drop by on Sundays as that's the day of celebration. He states he only talked to the [redacted] male as the [redacted] males did not appear to wish to talk. He states that these three individuals would not sit together in the bus, and they spread out on the bus sitting separately. He states that when they stopped, one of the white males got up and was starting to go out the door, when he started a conversation with the negro male and this white individual stopped. They talked about having a car and that they were going to Portland. The Hotel Rajneesh was discussed, however, he's unsure who brought up the subject of the Hotel Rajneesh. They did say, however, that they would "check it out". they appeared to be from the New York area as they were practicing "disciplined negligence". He described this as an attempt not to be fashionable.

We had to include our interview with [redacted] when he returned to the room and stated he had remembered some information about the [redacted] male standing in the doorway. He states that this man was a [redacted] male, kind of [redacted] in complexion, [redacted] looking with a [redacted] that he was approximately [redacted], [redacted] that he was very evil looking, had a very negative personality.

We next talked to [redacted]. He said he had contact with these individuals on 27th of July, 1983 at approximately 1900 hours. His girlfriend, [redacted], was working at the reception center and he was there waiting for her to get off work. That a yellow Volkswagen, very beat up, pulled up. He describes the first [redacted] male as a [redacted] male, [redacted] lbs., looking uncoordinated and very nervous. His hair was [redacted] and he was wearing a T shirt and jeans. The driver he describes as a [redacted] male, [redacted] years, [redacted] lbs., [redacted] hair, [redacted] shorter than the other man, more intelligent than the first [redacted] male. I asked if he heard any names mentioned, and he stated he did not. He described the [redacted] male as about [redacted] years, [redacted] to [redacted] complected, a [redacted] hairdo, a "good looking man". He states that these three appeared to be guys who wanted to "look at the girls" and check out the "free sex". He also felt that these individuals were from the east coast and not from the California area. He feels this is from hearing them talk and that their speech patterns appeared to be from the east coast.
